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Health Advisory: Initiating Precautions for the Enterovirus

There has been a lot of buzz lately about the Enterovirus spreading across the US, now including small numbers in Philadelphia. We have been closely monitoring our students, and we are not aware of any cases at GSFS. The health and safety of our students is our highest priority, and we are initiating precautionary procedures.

The Enterovirus presents like many other viruses: fever, runny nose, wheezing, coughing, and body aches. It can lead to very serious respiratory complications and require hospitalization, especially among children with asthma or other chronic conditions.

What is GSFS doing to keep our students healthy?

Because the outbreak in the US has reached Philadelphia, we will switch from our morning handshakes to the South Asian gesture of greeting accompanied by "Namaste" (Nahmahs-tay).

We already have hand sanitizer in every homeroom and hands-free hand dryers in every heavily used bathroom. Hand washing is extremely important for prevention and we are making increased hygiene a priority.

Your help is crucial to fight the spread of germs. Please review these easy tips with your children:

- Wash hands often for at least 20 seconds (sing "Happy Birthday" twice);
- Avoid touching eyes, nose, and mouth; and
- Don't share utensils, cups, and food.
