Starting this year, in addition to our on-going daily After School Program, GSFS launched an Enrichment Club Program. This program is offering a wide assortment of enrichment clubs for students to participate in during after school hours. Clubs are taught by experts and leading organizations in each field.

With the upcoming SPRING SESSION, we have new offerings, along with returning favorites. We also have expanded the grades that can participate in some of our returning favorites.

Clubs meet once a week. Due to the completion dates for our Winter Clubs, clubs will have varying start weeks, number of classes and costs. Please see the club descriptions for the specifics for each activity.

Enrollment Procedures

Enrollment will be on a first come first serve basis. **Spring Session registration forms are due by, Tuesday, March 5, 2019. Club fees are due with the registration form.** Each club has a minimum number of students needed for the club to proceed and a maximum number that can participate. You will be notified at least one week before the club is scheduled to begin that your child will be participating. If your child is not enrolled, your check will be returned to you. Club Schedule

Clubs will not run on half-days or days when Greene Street Friends School is closed. The number of classes has been determined based on the number of full days of GSFS that the class has to meet before the end of the school year.

Use of After School Program on Club Days

As noted in the club descriptions, clubs will have a start time of either 3:15 or 3:30. There will be no charge for students to come to ASP before the start of a club. Students who are not picked up when the club is finished will be brought to ASP. Families will be charged the 4PM pick-up rate (\$9.50) for any time that their students are at ASP from the end of the club until they are picked up by 6PM. Please keep in mind that ASP ends at 6PM and all students must be picked up by this time. After 6PM, the \$1 a minute rate applies.

SPORTS

Give and Go Basketball (New and Returning Students)

2nd - 4th Grade

8 classes

\$200 (\$120 for ASP Contract Students)

Wednesday, 3:15 to 4:15; April 3 through June 5, 2019 (No basketball week of April 15)

Minimum: 10 /Maximum 20

Kindergarten through 1st (Pre-K students can be added, if especially interested.)

9 classes

\$225 (\$135 for ASP Contract Students)

Fridays, 3:15 to 4:15; March 15 through May 31, 2019 (No basketball week of April 15)

Minimum: 10 /Maximum 15

Give and Go Basketball will focus on fundamentals and skill development for the first 2/3 of the Spring Session. During the final weeks, students will play games against one another. Each class will begin with a check-in with teammates, building the group dynamic, and a review of the theme and skill set for the day. Skill sets will combine large group lessons and dividing into smaller groups to practice the skills in stations. Activities are led in our NEW GYM!

Meet Our Coach:

Andre K. Wright, Co-Founder and Executive Director of Give and Go Athletics, has worked with children for over 15 years as a counselor, mentor, and athletic coach and was an inspirational college level player in his well-rounded and long term achievement. His drive to coach and mentor youth grew from a lifelong love of basketball and principled fundamental skill development. As a youth player, Andre's dedication to fundamentals and leadership earned him the McDonalds All-American nomination in 1997 and became the recipient of the Markward award for athletic excellence in the same year. After graduating from Benjamin Franklin High School, Andre played for legendary coach Larry Conti at Community College of Philadelphia before transferring to Neumann College. While playing for Neumann, Andre earned recognition as a P.A.C. 1st Team All-Conference selection (2005, 2006) and became Neumann College's Basketball Team Captain (2005, 2006). Andre also was coach nominated as the team's MVP in both 2005 and 2006, as he finished with 1,260 career points placing him at 8th all-time at Neumann. After College, Andre served at Stan Jones Prep High School as head coach and instituted mandatory study halls for players. Andre was fortunate to lead Stan Jones Prep students to three championship contending seasons. Andre is proud Give and Go Wright Athletics has been successful enough to run as a full time venture; supporting a membership of over 120 students, providing workouts and clinics to students ages 5-17 as well as summer camps and youth events throughout the year.

Give and Go is an organization that encourages the community to providing a positive ecosystem consisting of parents, mentors, educators, and peer associations is an effective strategy in reducing risky behaviors in the Philadelphia community. This uplifting ecosystem needs to extend beyond the formal school day, including positive mentoring and social interactions in a safe place after school. Mentoring must also include explicitly teaching students strategies for coping with and reducing stress. Give and Go basketball program seeks to build on children's physical skills and teach them fundamentals and teamwork.

PreKindergarten through 1st Grade

9 classes

The classes kick off with stimulating warm-up games followed by a muscle-warming stretch to get everyone ready for action. The bulk of each class focuses on skill-building activities and games. Individual, partner, and group activities are then introduced to optimize the experience for each child. Every session culminates in a scrimmage game (adapted variations for younger age groups) to familiarize each child with the structure of a game setting, while always encouraging our young kickers with positive reinforcement.

What is Soccer Stars:

Soccer Stars was founded in 2000 by Gustavo Szulansky, a New York City father of three and native of Argentina. With futbol in his blood and having spent countless dollars searching for quality programs for his own children, he founded the program determined to build the best children's program anywhere. Super Soccer Stars uses the soccer ball as the vehicle to help children not only improve their soccer skills, but also develop self-confidence, improve gross motor skills, hone socialization skills and more in a fun, non-competitive, educational environment. Specially designed curriculum uses positive reinforcement and a low child-to-coach ratio to ensure that each child improves at his or her own rate while having endless fun. All Super Soccer Stars classes are based on an age-specific curriculum created by a combination of early childhood, soccer, and education specialists to guarantee that each child is learning and having a blast from the moment the whistle blows.

Cultures of Movement: Celebrating global diversity through culture and dance with Lehlá Olson (New Programming)

Zumba is a fitness program created by Colombian dancer and choreographer Alberto "Beto" Perez s. It incorporates the movements from many cultures. Inspiration for Zumba can be found in soca, samba, merengue, mambo and hip-hop,

Lehla will break down the the background of Zumba by teaching students the dances of a different contributing country/culture each week. Some of the Zumba flavors/genres will include Salsa/Reggaeto, Cumbia,African,Indian/Bollywood/Bhangra, Old School Hip Hop/Kpop/Jpop/Cpop and Country Western.

Lehla's background in Zumba:

Lehla's interest and experience in music and movement comes from her background in various band, choir and international dance ensembles and groups since her childhood. Specific to international dance and fitness, she attended her first Zumba® class in 2009 and was hooked by the international flavor that speaks through each song and genre. After becoming licensed to teach in 2011, she went on to obtain a primary group exercise instructor certification from the Aerobics and Fitness Association of America as well as specialty Zumba® programs including Toning, Sentao, Step, Gold, Aqua, and STRONG. She has also diversified her fitness portfolio to include POUND fitness, African-Caribbean Dance Fitness, as well as more traditional fitness programs. Her goal in any of her classes for adults or young people is to create a safe, effective and fun movement experience that draws upon musical styles and appreciation from around the world. From wherever their starting point may be, Lehla encourages participants to push themselves mentally, spiritually, and physically — with as much smiling as possible.

Hip Hop with Hip Hop Fundamentals (New and Returning Students)

2nd Grade and Up

This program teach the dance basics of Breaking through drills, games, and team-building exercises. Students will create their own moves, learn Breaking foundation, and work in groups to begin the path of true Hip Hop Dance.

Meet our teacher:

Steve Believe graduated from Temple University with a Psychology Major, and is a certified Teaching Artist through Columbia University Teacher's college. A skilled dancer, lecturer, educator, and event organizer, Steve is passionate about empowering youth and the Hip Hop community. He is a founding partner of Hip Hop Fundamentals.

Hip Hop Fundamentals is an award-winning team of diverse professional Breakdancers dedicated to Hip Hop Education. They are the world's only Breakdance education company combining academic and social content with the world's most dynamic dance form. As certified teaching artists, seasoned performers, and battle-tested dancers, we are passionately driven to inspire audiences and participants of all ages. They've worked with schools, community sites, cultural/social organizations, museums, educational conferences and government agencies to bring their unique method of Breaking education to youth and adults.

Note: Students will get to see Steve Lunger, and his dance company, Hip Hop Fundamentals, perform for a morning assembly for the entire school on February 28 in honor of Black History Month.

Yoga Club (New and Returning Students)

PreKindergarten through 1st Grade

5 week Mini-Session

\$125 (\$75 for ASP-Contract Students)

Thursdays, 3:15 to 4:15; April 4 through May 9, 2019

Minimum: 6 /Maximum:10

This class will consist of music, movement, and mindfulness. Each week will have a different theme that will serve as the backdrop for our adventure. Club members will have the opportunity to co-create journeys to unlock greater awareness of their bodies, refine their hand-eye coordination, and gain a deeper understanding of their emotions. We will learn yoga postures, exercise our imaginations, and explore guided meditations. All this and more, while having a super fun time!

Meet our teacher:

LaVina has been practicing yoga since 2015 and has experienced a deep and positive transformation through the practice. She previously taught adult classes but found it transformative when she began teaching parent-child music, movement, and mindfulness classes through the Children's Music Express based out of Chestnut Hill. This inspired an entirely new realm of possibilities leading right into yoga for KIDS. She became 25hr RCYS certified and is excited to bring this opportunity to our young students.

STEAM CLUBS

Woodworking with Sherina Poorman and The Center for Creative Works (New Programming)

2nd Grade and Up

8 classes

\$200 (\$120 for ASP Contract Students)

Tuesdays, 3:15 to 4:15 (end time later on travel days); April 9 through May 28, 2019

Minimum 4 /Maximum 8

What this is about:

"Recent decades have seen woodworking and carpentry studies mostly disappear from education programs for kids..."

To remedy that, enter the Build-It Bus. Woodworker and educator Sherina Poorman designed kid-safe adaptive tools that she has brought to schools and art fairs around Philly about eight years to teach basic carpentry to Philly kids.

But it's not just educational for kids: artists from the Center for Creative Works (CCW), a vocational/arts center for adults with intellectual/developmental disabilities (IDD), who are participating in the Center's Teacher Corps program, are serving as the Build-It Bus' teachers and showing students how to use the tools." Sherina Poorman and a participant from The Center for Creative Works will guide kids as they make walking sticks – from tree to finished staff. Students will harvest a fallen

tree at a local woods. They will peel and shape the branches using manual tools used by wood workers for centuries: shave horses, spoke shaves, card scrapers, mortice and tenon tools. Finally they will “spruce” up their sticks with clay heads and beaded straps. On the last day teachers and student will take our sticks out for a hike.

This club will include local travel. On the second day of class, students will leave campus to harvest the green wood. This class will be two hours, instead of one. The final day of class will include leaving campus for a hike with the walking sticks. Separate permission slips will be given to class participants for these activities.

Art and Nature with Moira Schwartz (New Offering)

Pre-K through 1st Grade

10 classes

During the colder months artists will explore ways to create art inspired by nature in the studio, such as still life paintings and mixed media pieces. As the weather warms up we'll venture outside, explore the campus and tree lab. We'll create sculptures in nature and paint like the Impressionists, en plein air.

Build It/ Art with Moira Schwartz (New and Returning Students)

Students will learn about abstract and realistic sculptures while investigating different building materials and textures. Students will also learn about the work of various sculptors. Studio projects will be mixed media.

Moira earned a BFA in Textile Design and an Art Education Certification for K-12 Art from Moore College of Art and Design. She has taught in the classroom, worked as a Museum Educator at the Philadelphia Museum of Art, Delaware Art Museum and other art centers for 11 years. When I'm not teaching I love spending time with my family, listening to music, running in the Wissahickon and making my own art.

Snapology/Robotics (1st graders are invite to join in on the fun this session!)

Cello with Annie Givler

Families will be required to rent a cello for their student.

Come one, come all! Now recruiting budding cellists for the new GREENE STREET FRIENDS CELLO SOCIETY! Specifically for 1st through 4th graders, students will have the opportunity to dip their feet in the waters of instrumental music study by learning the cello. Annie will host this club in the music room after school on Fridays from 3:30-4:15. Students will rent an

appropriately sized cello through Mt. Airy Violins and begin their studies. The session will conclude with a performance open to all.

Annie and her love of the cello:

Annie began playing cello at the age of 2 and holds two degrees in cello performance. She has taught and performed all over the world sharing stages with renowned artists from Yo-yo Ma to Kanye West. Annie is frequently contracted, both nationally and internationally, as a Suzuki cello clinician. She can't wait to share her passion for the cello with the Greene Street Community!

Ukulele Lessons (New and Returning Students)

2nd through 4th Grade

10 classes

\$250 (\$150 for ASP Contract Students)

Fridays, 3:30 to 4:30; March 15 through May 31, 2019

Minimum: 6 /Maximum:12

Families will be required to purchase a ukulele for their student. A list of preferred ukuleles will be provided with enrollment confirmation. Average cost: \$55.

These classes are taught as a group lesson with partnering activities. Topics covered include strumming and picking technique, chords and songs starting with one chord songs and progressing to 3 or 4 chord songs, learning to read tablature and playing melodies, as well as performance techniques while playing with others. New and returning students are encouraged to participate. Skills sets will be taught in groups based upon student's level. The session will conclude with a performance open to all.

As a first instrument, ukuleles teach kids about music and music theory. Through these ukulele lessons, a child learns about beat, harmony, melody, rhythm, and tempo. The ukulele also helps children develop eye-hand coordination as well as independent movement of fingers. If you have a child who wants to eventually learn the violin or guitar, starting with a ukulele often makes the process easier and less frustrating.

Meet our teacher:

Stephan Hayes started playing the guitar and writing songs at the age of 12. He has been a life-long musician, playing in several Philadelphia area bands, recording albums and touring the country. Stephan began teaching music while living in Guangzhou China. He spent 4 years as the Elementary Music teacher at an International School. During that time, he also began teaching private music lessons on the guitar, bass drums and ukulele. Stephan's experiences in China inspired him to continue teaching back in the USA. He now attends West Chester University's Music Education program and teaches private lessons through two area music studios. Stephan is passionate about making music fun, accessible, interesting and expressive for students of all ages.
