## **Community Takes A Walk for a Cause**



# **Keeping Healthy This Winter**

As we move toward the cold and flu season, we ask you to share with your children the following easy steps that can be taken to help insure that our children remain safe and healthy while at GSFS and at home:

- Wash your hands often. Most cold and flu viruses are spread by direct contact.
